Entrepreneurship Education in Greenland

At the request of and in partnership with the people of Greenland, USAID is working with the Fonden for Entreprenørskab / Foundation for Entrepreneurship (FFE) to foster the next generation of Greenlandic entrepreneurs, contributing to an entrepreneurial ecosystem across Greenland.

U.S.-Greenland Enterprise Driven Growth Initiative (EDGI)

To support Greenland's economic growth goals and increase trade opportunities with the U.S., USAID will implement the U.S.-Greenland Enterprise Driven Growth Initiative (EDGI) in cooperation with a broad set of Greenlandic private sector and government stakeholders. This work will be anchored in a commitment to local sustainability and ownership, respect for the environment, and inclusivity of indigenous populations.
