In order to support USAID's objectives to Strengthen Programs to Improve Health Status in Africa, Africa's Health in 2010 (AH 2010) will provide services that include:

- Providing strategic, analytical, information dissemination and advocacy support to the Africa Bureau, including AID/W, USAID Missions, USAID Regional programs, as well as African institutions and networks.
- Identifying implementation constraints and emerging priorities that threaten or limit program performance and/or exacerbate problems to improving African health status.
- Assisting USAID and its development partners to identify innovative approaches to address and overcome these problems.
- Assisting AFR to evaluate regional and country programs aimed at assessing results achieved or not achieved, learning from these experiences and sharing promising practices to advance organizational learning and tell the Agency's story.
- Supporting issues identification, analysis, sharing of promising practices, monitoring and evaluation across the areas of: Maternal and Child Health; Infectious Diseases; Reproductive Health; Multi-sectoral support to improving health outcomes, and Health System financing.

Purpose:

The E&E Regional Family Planning Activity is designed to build the capacity of USAID E&E family planning (FP) programs to improve service delivery and expand FP use with the ultimate aim to increase modern contraceptive use and decrease abortion rates. The E&E Regional Family Planning Activity has three components: 1) creation of a policy environment more favorable to FP in E&E countries; 2) replicating and expanding already proven FP best practices in the region; and 3) investing in the private sector for improved delivery of family planning services and products.

Services Provided:

The E&E Regional Family Planning Activity offers technical assistance to existing E&E FP/RH country programs to engage in policy dialogues and implement proven programmatic practices. The project is designed to collect and serve as a repository for best practices from the E&E region as well as to share those practices across the region through the support of cross visits, family planning workshops, and provider trainings. The project also has the capacity to work with country programs to identify needs and develop strategic plans to implement and expand family planning programs in the public sector.

This project works in conjunction with the Private Sector Partnerships-One (PSP-One) Project to identify and capitalize on private sector opportunities to improve contraceptive access. Through a scope of work which missions can utilize, EE/DGST offers access to PSP-One technical assistance.

Purpose:

This grant supports the LAC Bureau's Health Policy objectives in the LAC Region. It is comprised of 7 chapters in the areas of Infectious Diseases, Maternal/Newborn Health and Health Systems Strengthening. The seven chapters include:

- Infectious Diseases (Regional) - Focuses on Anti-microbial resistance and TB control policies throughout the region but with emphasis on Central America and the Caribbean
- AMI (Amazon Malaria Initiative) - Focus on policies for controlling the malaria epidemic in the Amazon Basin. Day to Day management of this component resides in the Mission in Peru.*
- SAIDI (South America Infectious Diseases Initiative) - Building off of past work done through the AMI, this focuses on antimicrobial resistance and TB control policies in South America. Day to day management of this component resides with the Mission in Peru, however the work is closely aligned with the regional infectious diseases activities.*
- Maternal and Neonatal Health (Regional) - Focuses on health policy regarding Post Partum Hemorrhage, and New born asphyxia on a regional level.
- Health Sector Reform (Regional) - Focuses on Stewardship, the Essential Public Health Functions and improved linkages with reform and vertical programs.
- Health Information Systems (Regional) - Focuses on consolidation of routine information systems to better meet public health priorities.
- Avian Influenza (Regional) - Focuses on regional pandemic preparedness

Services Provided:

The various chapters of this grant are designed to gather evidence, best practices and lessons learned to inform the policy process, assist countries to communicate the need for new policies or to implement established policies through specific methodologies and frameworks, to monitor the effects of policies and to ensure that many stakeholders are involved in the policy process.

This grant agreement will be extended until 9/08 for select activities. LAC expects to award a new grant to PAHO by 9/07 for other follow-on activities.

Purpose:

The Displaced Children and Orphans Fund (DCOF) provides financial and technical assistance for community-based programs that assist vulnerable children who are separated or orphaned and without parental or adult supervision.

Services Provided:

This fund is coordinated and supported by the Office of Democracy and Governance, although most activities are implemented through USAID Mission - managed grants and agreements. The major portion of these funds are used to support programs activities and provide technical assistance for three categories of children who are at "extreme risk," including street children, war-affected children and children affected by HIV/AIDS.

DCOF currently supports programs in 5 countries.

The War Victims Fund

Purpose:

The Patrick J. Leahy War Victims Fund (LWVF) provides financial and technical assistance to programs that address the needs of people living with disabilities, primarily those who suffer from mobility-related injuries, caused by unexploded ordnance (UXO), including anti-personnel landmines, and other direct and indirect causes of physical disability (polio and other preventable diseases that might result from interrupted immunization campaigns).

Services Provided:

The LWVF is concerned with the provision of orthopedic services and devices to ensure unassisted mobility for civilian war victims and other persons with disabilities. Assistance may include training and institutional capacity strengthening, facilities upgrading, materials provision, and support for national disabilities policy reform and public advocacy. In addition, programs include support for increasing the social and economic opportunities of these survivors.

This fund is coordinated and supported by the Office of Democracy and Governance, although most activities are implemented through grants and agreements that are managed by USAID Missions.

The LWVF currently supports program activities in 1 country.

Victims of Torture Fund

Purpose:

The Victims of Torture Fund (VTF) provides financial and technical assistance to programs worldwide that assist in the rehabilitation of individuals who suffer from the physical and psychological effects of torture.

Services Provided:

The VTF primarily supports programs that help heal the psychological and physical trauma caused by torture. Additionally, the Fund recognizes that communities, along with survivors, need to heal and recover. To this end, the Fund supports programs that affirm the dignity of the survivor by restoring his or her position as a functioning and contributing member of the family and the community.

The Fund works through nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) overseas that (1) provide direct services to survivors, their families, and communities; (2) strengthen the capacity of country-based institutions in their delivery of services to survivors; and (3) increase the level of knowledge and understanding about the needs of torture victims.

The Fund supports activities in 23 countries that attend to the medical, psychological, and social needs of torture survivors and their families. These programs include advocacy, training, technical assistance, and research.

The Fund is coordinated and supported by the Office of Democracy and Governance, although most activities are implemented through grants and agreements that are managed by USAID Missions.
