This week the world will be watching as President and Mrs. Bush travel to Africa to meet with respected African leaders and draw attention to programs and initiatives that have worked to meet the most basic human needs. As President Bush visits Benin, Tanzania, Rwanda, Ghana and Liberia, he will be reviewing PEPFAR and the President's Malaria Initiative (PMI), two cutting edge programs that have saved millions of Africans across the continent. This occurs as the FDA decides to give tentative approval of a new generic drug to fight HIV. While waiting approval for purchase in the U.S., Reyataz is eligible for purchase abroad through PEPFAR. Information on this visit is included below, and we promise to keep you informed on any new developments or announcements made during the President's trip.

In other news, this week offers information on an array of seminars and forums available for organizations wishing to play a greater role in international development, including a public forum on the Global Development Commons (GDC), the International Food Aid Conference, a Global Fund Workshop in Kenya, and a United Way Grant-Writing Workshop. In addition to this, the SEED Initiative, a USAID partner, is calling for submissions by organizations in a competitive awards program. SEED Award Winners receive a tailored package of support services to help them to become established and to increase their impact. Participation and inclusion have been long-standing USAID principles, and we are proud to keep you informed of any new opportunities.

### **President Bush Travels to Africa February 15-21**

On February 14<sup>th</sup>, the day before he embarked on a six day trip Africa, President Bush made a speech on Africa Policy at the Smithsonian National Museum of African Art in Washington, D.C. To read the First Lady and President's moving words regarding the United State's commitment to continually aid Africa, [click here](#). In the speech, President Bush released statistics of the success his various initiatives are having in Africa and poignantly described the stories of individual beneficiaries of the various programs. He also announced that,

"Last year, we launched the Africa Financial Sector Initiative. As part of this effort, our Overseas Private Investment Corporation mobilized \$750 million in investment capital for African businesses. Today, I'm announce that OPIC will support five new investment funds that will mobilize an additional \$875 million, for a total of more than \$1.6 billion in new capital."

And that,

“... we're working to empower Africans to alleviate hunger, expand education, and fight disease. America is proud to be the world's largest provider of food assistance, including emergency food stocks that have saved lives in places like Ethiopia, or Sudan, and other African nations. It's a noble effort on our people's part. I don't know if -- most Americans don't understand that we're the world's largest provider of food to feed the hungry, but we are. (Applause.)

Yet our ultimate objective is to do more than respond to the hungry -- it is to help African countries feed their own people. So I have proposed that America purchase crops directly from farmers in Africa, instead of just shipping food assistance from the developed world. (Applause.) This initiative would build up local agriculture markets. It would help break the cycle of famine. And it deserves the full support of the United States Congress.”

Today the President and the First Lady depart for Benin, where they will meet with the President and speak to the press on Africa policy issues. From Benin, President Bush will travel to Tanzania to sign the Millennium Challenge Compact for Tanzania, greet families of victims of the 1998 Embassy bombing, and speak on the President's Malaria Initiative Vouchers and Catch Up Program. After Tanzania, the President will continue to Rwanda where he will visit Kigali Memorial Centre, participate in the Dedication of the U.S. Embassy of Kigali, and observe a PEPFAR project. In Ghana, President and Mrs. Bush will have lunch with Peace Corps Volunteers and will visit Trade Hub beneficiaries. In Liberia, President and Mrs. Bush will break at the Barclay Training Center to discuss Teacher Training at a Roundtable event.

#### **PUBLIC MEETING: A FORUM ON DEMOCRATIC GOVERNANCE AND ECONOMIC GROWTH**

**Keynote:** Henrietta H. Fore, USAID Administrator and Director of Foreign Assistance, will speak on the Global Development Commons, including its role as a driver of development and the link between economic growth and democratic governance. She will also provide an update on USAID's response to the ACVFA working groups' recommendations.

**Democratic Governance and Economic Growth:** An examination of what has worked successfully in democratic governance and economic growth programs will be discussed in two parts. Particular attention will be paid to those programs that have been or could be successfully replicated in other countries.

**Cutting Edge Partnerships:** Carol Adelman, ACVFA Vice Chair, will lead a discussion with representatives from the corporate, foundation, and end user communities on innovative partnerships that have stimulated economic growth and promoted good democratic governance. Panelists will include Lauren Moser Counts with Shorebank, Corey Griffin with Microsoft Corporation, Donald F. Terry with the Inter-American Development Bank, Jennifer Hodgson with WINGS Global Fund for Community Foundations and a representative from Global Giving.

**USAID and Partners:** Successes and challenges in creating high growth democratic countries with a specific focus on USAID's contributions will be examined. Possible countries for discussion may include Costa Rica, India, Botswana, Chile, and Estonia. Moderated by Ted Weihe, ACVFA Member, the panel will include Simeon Djankov with the World Bank, Chad Evans with the Council on Competitiveness, Mary Ott with USAID's Office of Economic Growth, Mary Ryckman with the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative and Dorothy Taft with USAID's Office of Democracy and Governance.

**Global Knowledge Sharing for Development:** Knowledge management tools, including the Global Development Commons, will be discussed as to how they could benefit the variety of actors in democratic governance and economic growth. Bill Hammink and Steve Gale from USAID, Helga Leifsdottir with ReliefWeb and a representative from the private sector will take part in a discussion moderated by Judith Hermanson, ACVFA Member.

## FDA Grants Tentative Approval For Generic Reyataz

On February 4th, the FDA granted tentative approval for Emcure Pharmaceuticals ' generic formulation of Bristol-Myers Squibb 's Reyataz ( atazanavir ) capsules 100, 150 and 200mg for the treatment of HIV in combination with other antiretroviral medications. Although the generic version of atazanavir, a new-generation once-daily protease inhibitor, is not yet fully approved for sale in the US, it is eligible for purchase outside of this region under the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) program.

Emcure signed a non-exclusive license and technology transfer collaboration agreement with BMS for the manufacture and distribution of generic versions of Reyataz in February 2006. Under the terms agreed, BMS provided a royalty-free license to operate under the relevant patents and transferred to Emcure its technical know-how related to the manufacturing, testing, packaging, storage and handling of the active pharmaceutical ingredient and the finished dosage form of atazanavir.

## VA Accepting Applications for Homeless Providers Grant and Per Diem Program

*The Department of Veterans Affairs has asked us to make you aware of the following grant notice that was made available today. This is geared more for domestic purposes, but we wanted you all to know about this anyway.*

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has announced availability of funds under the Grant and Per Diem Program (GPD) aimed at helping America's veterans to achieve self-sufficiency by providing transitional housing and other services.

### **Capital Grants: Approximately \$25 million available for capital grants**

VA is making approximately \$25 million in capital grants available for the following: (1) remodeling or alteration of existing buildings; (2) acquisition of buildings, acquisition and rehabilitation of buildings; (3) new construction, and (4) acquisition of vans (in connection with a new or existing Grant and Per Diem Grant project) for outreach to and transportation for homeless veterans.

### **Per Diem Only Awards: Approximately \$12 million available for Per Diem Only awards to create approximately 1,000 beds**

VA is also accepting applications for "Per Diem Only" awards that will create approximately 1,000 beds and provide transitional housing and services to: (1) serve women, women with care of dependent children; (2) serve all veterans in the states of: Vermont, Nebraska and Alaska, and (3) Indian Tribal governments. Approximately \$12 million is available.
