Pilot ways to **translate applications** from local languages to English.

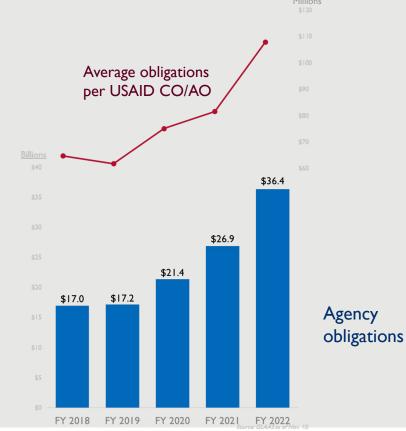


Expand **cost recovery** options.

Increased obligations result in larger workload for existing CO/AO staff



As USAID obligations have increased, the average USAID CO/AO obligations increased from \$64.9 million in FY 2018 to **\$108 million** in FY 2022.

At the same time, there was an increase in co-creation and other time-intensive A&A processes.
