




GOVERNANCE REFORMS IMPLEMENTED

CIVIL SOCIETY AND PRIVATE SECTOR PARTNERSHIPS

17 locally led partnerships with civil society and private sector organizations established to promote the Legalization Program through citizen engagement and social media outreach.



EGALIZATION OUTREACH CAMPAIGN IN PARTNER MUNICIPALITIES

16,544 door-to-door visits with owners of unpermitted constructions, 38 legalization promotional videos developed and published and multiple citizen informational events organized by the Activity and its partners.



MAINTAINED MACROECONOMIC STABILITY

By end of 2021, the deficit budget stood at 0.6% of GDP and the usable bank balance at 4% of GDP, compared to 5.4% and 3.5% respectively in 2020, signaling robust economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.



INCREASED VOLUNTARY TAX COMPLIANCE

Improved Tax Administration of Kosovo (TAK) efficiency through the introduction of five new electronic services, online seminars, printed and audiovisual informational materials for taxpayers.
