





POWER AFRICA A U.S. GOVERNMENT-LED PARTNERSHIP

Power Africa is a U.S. Government-led partnership, coordinated by USAID, that brings together the collective resources of over 200 public and private sector partners to double access to electricity in sub-Saharan Africa.

Since 2013, Power Africa has helped deliver new or improved electricity to nearly **200 million** people across sub-Saharan Africa. Power Africa-supported projects are generating nearly **7,600 MW** of new, cleaner and more reliable electricity, helping to mitigate climate change and end energy poverty. In 2023, Power Africa-supported renewable power generation projects helped avoid more than 10 million tons of CO₂ emissions, the equivalent of removing over 2.2 million gas-powered cars from the road for one year.¹

Transaction Focus: By addressing the critical barriers that hinder progress of a particular deal, we create a ripple effect for other deals facing similar issues in the country.



On-the-Ground Support: Power Africa's in-country advisors identify the technical, financial, and political solutions needed to facilitate faster access to power.



Working Beyond the Grid: With numerous investors and partners committed to finding small-scale and off-grid renewable energy solutions, Power Africa is providing millions of people access to reliable and sustainable electricity for the first time.



Bridging the Financing Gap: Power Africa's aim is to de-risk investments to enable public and private investors to fund projects that drive systemic reforms.



African-led Reform: Power Africa works with African governments to fill critical skills gaps, drive reforms, and build and maintain power sectors for generations to come.



Empowering and Powering Women: Power Africa supports projects, programs and policies that strive to reduce gender inequalities and promote engagement of both men and women.


