Description of Organization: GH serves as USAID's primary source of technical expertise, leadership, and donor coordination for the health sector, including HIV/AIDS; infectious diseases; maternal and child health and nutrition; family planning and reproductive health; and health systems strengthening and reform. GH is responsible for advancing field-relevant, state-of-the-art research and the transfer of new technologies and approaches to field programs. Through its staff, programs, and country teams, GH provides critical support to USAID Missions and field programs in more than 70 countries.

The Office of Population and Reproductive Health (PRH) is the locus for programs that directly foster and promote expanded access to high-quality voluntary family planning services and information in order to reduce unintended pregnancy and foster improved reproductive health behaviors. PRH provides strategic direction, global technical leadership, and support to country programs; ensures responsiveness to Congressional and Administration priorities, directives and restrictions and provides information on USAID's FP/RH programs to a range of stakeholders. The Service Delivery Improvement Division works to provide global leadership, knowledge management, and support to USAID missions to expand access to and use of quality, voluntary FP/RH information, products and services, with a focus on reaching underserved groups and youth

Duties and Responsibilities: The Health Development Officer serves as a technical advisor to USAID Missions to advance critical initiatives, bilateral/regional development objectives and/or operational targets and goals. In addition, the incumbent makes significant contributions to the design of new centrally managed family planning projects consistent with Agency and PRH objectives and technical priorities, and works closely with Office of Acquisition and Assistance staff in technical review of Program Descriptions and Proposals submitted in response to Requests for Assistance and Requests for Proposal. The Health Development Officer fosters and maintains

appropriate rapport with external customers and develops working relationships with external organizations as required. The Officer will attend and represent Agency and PRH at internal USAID and USG events as well as at external meetings and events to articulate Agency and PRH technical and project/program priorities. The Officer is expected to travel internationally at or around 25%.

As a Health Development Officer, you will:

- Lead private sector investment and partnership portfolio, including examining major issues in family planning and reproductive health service delivery and market development approaches.
- Serve as Team Leader of the Private Sector Team and Report to the Service Delivery Improvement Division Chief.
- Serve as an agency subject matter expert on family planning/reproductive health (FP/RH) service delivery programs and FP/RH private sector and market development approaches.
- Serve as a technical advisor to USAID Missions and Regional Bureaus to advance critical initiatives, bilateral/regional development objectives and/or operational targets and goals with regard to the private health sector, including family planning and reproductive health.
- Work with representatives of other Global Health Offices, other USAID Bureaus, other USG agencies, international organizations, NGOs, private sector groups, and donors to assure that USAID partnerships respond to key priorities, private sector programming/projects are developed and implemented in a manner that reflects past investments and builds on best practices and growing evidence, and that strategies, programs, and projects that prove successful are shared and replicated when appropriate.
- Potentially serve as COR/AOR and/or technical advisor for centrally managed FP/RH activities, performing program/project management functions and providing input regarding technical direction for private sector health programs and projects.

Qualifications: To qualify for the position of Health Development Officer, FL-0685-02 you must possess the required basic education requirements and specialized experience specific to the series and grade you are applying to.

Basic Education Requirements: Bachelor's or graduate/higher level degree: major study in an academic field related to the medical field, health sciences or allied sciences appropriate to the work of the position. This degree must be from an educational program from an accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education at the time the degree was obtained.

Specialized Experience: For the FL-0685-02, you must have one year of specialized experience at the FL-03 (GS-13) grade level or equivalent. Specialized experience is defined as:

- Designing, implementing, managing, monitoring, and evaluating large global health donor-funded private sector focused family planning and reproductive health or related health area area grants, contracts, and/or cooperative agreements;
- Providing technical guidance and support to Missions, PVOs/NGOs, and/or host countries on technical issues regarding the design and implementation of private sector health, including family planning and reproductive health;
- Representing organizations at intergovernmental or professional discussions focused on global health.

Qualifications:

- Technical expertise in public health and private sector engagement, with a focus on family planning, reproductive health, HIV/AIDS or other health area;
- Experience in designing, implementing and evaluating family planning/reproductive health or related health programs internationally, particularly in low and middle income countries;
- Thorough knowledge of Health Service Delivery as a discipline, particularly related to the private health sector;
- Experience serving as a technical resource to counterparts at global and country levels, especially related to private health sector and market development approaches;
- Experience in project management methods and management skills to manage multiple activities simultaneously and ensure quality, timeliness, and cost-effectiveness;
- Ability to function in a collaborative and collegial environment;
- Strong personnel management and interpersonal skills
- Strong speaking and public presentation skills; and
- Master's degree in public health, business administration, or other related field, with 8+ years of international development experience.
