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**Abstract**

The *Overview of Contraceptive and Condom Shipments*, an annual publication, summarizes contraceptive and condom shipments sponsored by USAID, by value and unit.

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# Overview of Contraceptive and Condom Shipments

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) has provided commodities for family planning and reproductive health activities since the mid-1960s. Thanks to USAID and other international donors, the use rates for contraceptives and condoms have increased in most parts of the world. In fiscal year (FY) 2014, USAID continued to respond to the increasing need for foreign assistance by providing family planning and reproductive health commodities to Missions in four of the five agency's regions: Africa, Asia, Europe and Eurasia (E&E), and Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC). There were no shipments to the Middle East region.


In 1990, to support this worldwide effort, a centralized system—the Central Contraceptive Procurement Project—was created to provide contraceptives and condoms needed in USAID's field programs. The Commodities Security and Logistics (CSL) Division of USAID's Office of Population and Reproductive Health was tasked with administering this system. The division works with country programs and other donors to provide technical leadership, ensure that commodities are available to anyone who wants to use them, support a program for improved supply chain design and logistics management in developing countries, and maintain a database for USAID commodity assistance.

USAID Missions determine the quantity and type of contraceptives and condoms required for their programming; they place orders with the CSL division for these commodities. This report includes details of data gathered in FY 2014 on those contraceptive and condom shipments. The data analysis is organized by a worldwide overview, USAID region, and commodity type. The report provides details on both the value and quantity of shipments from FY 2012–2014. It should be noted that one-year fluctuations in contraceptive and condom shipments at the regional- and country-levels do not necessarily result from programmatic shifts. In fact, variations in country supply plans and shipment schedules from one year to the next often account for these fluctuations.

## Commodity Fund


The Commodity Fund (CF) provides central funding to procure male and female condoms for HIV/AIDS programs and it ensures their expedited delivery to USAID-supported countries. Since its inception in FY 2002, the annual funding for the CF has ranged from \$10.1 million to \$31.9 million. In FY 2014, the funding allocated to the CF totaled \$22.2 million.

The value of condom orders that the CF shipped and paid for in FY 2014 totaled \$21.7 million. Of that, 78 percent of the value was for male condoms and 22 percent was for female condoms—the same as FY 2013.






# Worldwide Contraceptive and Condom Shipments




**Figure 1. Trends in Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values, FY 2005–2014**

- While the worldwide 10-year trend in the value of contraceptive and condom shipments is increasing; during the past three years, the value shipped continues on a slight downward trend (see figure 1).
- The aim of USAID focusing resources to regions with the greatest need continued with Africa receiving most of the worldwide shipments, followed by Asia; with significantly lower values directed to the LAC and E&E regions (see figure 2).
- As a result of a decrease in unit price (see tables 2 and 3) and the Implant Access Initiative, FY 2014 contraceptive implant shipments continued to show a decrease in value, but an increase in the quantity shipped. A spike in quantity was attributed to Asia.
- All regions showed a decrease in value of shipments during FY 2013, with the most significant percentage change in E&E and LAC. The Middle East showed a large decline because there were no requests from this region in FY 2014 (see table 1).
- Although declining slightly in value and quantity, male condom shipments continued the trend started last year; it remained the largest share of commodity values shipped worldwide—more than double the value of implants and orals (see figure 3 and table 2).
- Intrauterine device (IUD) shipments showed the greatest decline in value shipped; however, the decrease in quantity was less extreme (see tables 2 and 3).
- Governmental programs again received the majority of worldwide contraceptive and condom shipments in FY 2014, followed by social marketing, nongovernmental organization (NGO), and research programs (see figure 4).






Figure 5. Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2005–2014

- Governmental shipment values worldwide have increased since FY 2010. This is largely due to significant support to Asia—Pakistan, in particular—and to Africa; governmental support is leveling off at just over 50 percent. Overall support to NGOs has decreased over recent years (see figure 5).

Figure 4. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: Worldwide, FY 2014



# Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Africa




**Figure 6. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Africa, FY 2005–2014**

- For the second year in a row, shipment values to Africa have decreased to the lowest value since FY 2010. Despite this decrease, Africa is the region that receives the largest amount of support from USAID; it shows an overall upward trend of shipment values during the past 10 years. Most of the upward trend is due to contraceptive shipments because the condom shipments have only increased minimally (see figure 6 and table 4).
- In FY 2014, 28 African-region countries requested commodities, an increase over the 24 countries that requested in FY 2013 and 26 countries in FY 2012 (see table 4).
- As seen in previous years, all methods are well represented in this region, with the exception of IUDs, which account for only one percent of the value shipped (see figure 7).
- Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Ethiopia, and Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) requested the largest value shipments in FY 2014. These countries represent an increase over the previous year, most significantly DRC. Uganda and Kenya followed as major recipients in FY 2014, despite decreases in values (see figure 8 and table 4).
- Ghana, Nigeria, and Zambia saw a decline in shipment values during the past three years because shipments to social marketing programs declined in all three countries, including a public-sector program in Zambia (see table 4).
- Governmental programs in Africa continued as the primary program type this year, receiving nearly half of the shipment values—a smaller share than last year. Social marketing was nearly equal, with 44 percent of shipment values (see figure 9).






Figure 10. Africa Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2005–2014

- As in recent years, Africa received similar support for governmental and social marketing programs; NGO support was significantly less than these two program types in the region (see figure 10).

Figure 9. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: Africa, FY 2014

# Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Asia



- Values shipped to Asia in FY 2014 have leveled off as support to Bangladesh has diminished (see figure 11 and table 5). The region's shipment values rose dramatically in FY 2011 because of increased support to Bangladesh and Pakistan.
- Six countries in the Asia region requested commodities in FY 2014, a decrease from seven in FY 2013, and 11 in FY 2012 (see table 5).




Figure 12. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Asia by Method, FY 2014

- The region continued to request a diverse range of products, except for female condoms, which were not represented in the method mix in FY 2014 (see figure 12).
- Injectable contraceptives to the Asia region are the only commodity that has increased in value and quantity during the past three years; female condoms and orals have declined, while male condoms, implants, and IUDs have fluctuated.





Figure 13. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Asia: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- With 80 percent of all shipment values in the region, Pakistan received all methods except female condoms (see figure 13, table 5, and appendix 3).
- Despite the focus of support to Pakistan, Nepal was the only country in FY 2014 to request a significant increase in shipment values compared to FY 2013 (see figure 13 and table 5).
- Governmental programs represented 86 percent of shipment values in FY 2014 to Asia, largely due to the value shipped to Pakistan, as well as smaller values to Afghanistan. The 13 percent in social marketing shipments went to Nepal, Myanmar, and Bangladesh (see figure 14).






Figure 15. Asia Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2005–2014

- The 10-year trend for program type reflects a decrease in social marketing programs in Bangladesh and a refocus of support to Pakistan governmental programs (see figure 15).

Figure 11. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Asia, FY 2005–2014

Figure 14. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: Asia, FY 2014

# Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Latin America and the Caribbean



- A downward trend of LAC shipment values during the past 10 years is due to programs graduating from USAID support; however, recent years show consistent support of between \$3 million and \$4 million per year (see figure 16 and table 6).
- The number of countries requesting shipments in FY 2014 for the LAC region was down to three countries, a reduction of three from the two prior years (see table 6).




Figure 17. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to LAC by Method, FY 2014

- Male condoms again accounted for the majority of shipment values to the region, with the Dominican Republic requesting the largest value and quantity of male condoms (see figure 17 and table 6).





Figure 18. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to LAC: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- Haiti continued to receive the largest shipment values in the region. It was the only country in the LAC region to request commodities in addition to male condoms. Haiti received the entire value of injectables, orals, implants, and IUDs shipped to the region in FY 2014 (see figures 17 and 18).
- The three countries in the LAC region that received shipments in FY 2014 were Haiti, the Dominican Republic, and Trinidad and Tobago. The Dominican Republic was the only country to receive an increase in shipment values (see table 6).
- In FY 2014, social marketing programs overtook NGO programs for the largest program type supported and received—53 percent of FY 2014 shipment values to LAC (see figure 19).




Figure 20. LAC Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2005–2014

- LAC support to NGO programs has decreased as a percentage of the total shipments in the last year, after a sharp upward trend in FY 2013; while social marketing programs show a slowly increasing trend during the past three years (see figure 20).

Figure 16. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to LAC, FY 2005–2014

Figure 19. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: LAC, FY 2014

# Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Europe and Eurasia



- Shipment support to the E&E region has been sporadic during the past 10 years. The most recent four years show consistent, but minimal, support to the region (see figure 21).




Figure 22. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to E&E by Method, FY 2014

- The methods shipped to the region in FY 2014 were limited to two contraceptive methods ordered: contraceptive implants and IUDs (see figure 22).





Figure 23. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to E&E: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- With the exception of a small shipment of male condoms to Armenia in FY 2013, Georgia has been the sole recipient of shipments during the most recent years (see figure 23 and table 7).





Figure 25. E&E Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2005–2014

- The region ordered a total value of \$0.07 million for FY 2014 shipments, which were directed exclusively to governmental programs in Georgia. Historically, shipments were primarily directed to NGOs until FY 2011, when NGO support ended and considerably smaller shipments were directed to governmental programs (see figures 24 and 25).

Figure 21. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to E&E, FY 2005–2014

Figure 24. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: E&E, FY 2014

# Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to the Middle East



- Shipments during the past 10 years to the Middle East have declined significantly, with minimal or no shipments after FY 2007. FY 2014 had no shipments to the region (see figure 26).
- During the past 3 years, Jordan was the only recipient in the region to request small shipments (see table 8).




Figure 27. Middle East Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2005–2014

- Historically, when support is directed to the region, it has been directed to governmental programs (see figure 27).

Figure 26. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to the Middle East, FY 2005–2014






# Worldwide Oral Contraceptive Shipments



- FY 2014 continued the same trend as previous years—with a gradual decline—contributing to the overall downward 10-year trend in oral contraceptive shipments (see figure 28).




Figure 29. Oral Contraceptive Shipment Values by Region, FY 2014

- While the Africa region continued to request the largest amount of oral contraceptives, all regions received fewer quantities and values in FY 2014 compared to FY 2013; there were no oral shipments to the E&E or the Middle East regions (see figure 29 and table 9).
- The total number of countries that ordered oral contraceptives decreased by two from FY 2013 to FY 2014, with 21 countries ordering in FY 2014 (see table 9).





Figure 30. Oral Contraceptive Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- This year, Pakistan received the largest total for orals orders worldwide; the country has been a major recipient for the most recent four years. However, the past three years show a decline in shipments to Pakistan (see figure 30 and table 9).
- After previous trends of receiving larger shipments of orals, Mozambique and Bangladesh again did not request orals in FY 2014 (see table 9).
- Kenya and Mali showed increasing shipment quantities during the past three years, while Guinea and Mozambique have not received shipments in the past two years (see table 9).
- While DRC and Rwanda show a significant shipment increase this year over last year; a look at three years of shipment totals does not show a specific trend in oral contraceptive shipments for either country (see table 9).

Figure 28. Trends in Worldwide Oral Contraceptive Shipments, FY 2005–2014



# Worldwide Injectable Contraceptive Shipments



- The quantities of injectable contraceptives shipped during the past 10 years reflect an overall upward trend. However, the past three years show declining numbers (see figure 31).




Figure 32. Injectable Contraceptive Shipment Values by Region, FY 2014

- For the second year in a row, only Africa, Asia, and LAC requested injectable shipments. Africa received the largest quantity in FY 2014—60 percent of all shipment values, followed by Asia and LAC (see figure 32 and table 10).
- Although, overall, the quantities of injectable contraceptives have declined, the number of requesting countries has remained at 20 since FY 2013 (see table 10).





Figure 33. Injectable Contraceptive Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- Pakistan was again the country to request the largest quantity and value in FY 2014, with 27 percent of the worldwide injectable shipment values. Despite this, a smaller quantity and value was shipped to Pakistan in FY 2014 compared to FY 2013 (see figure 33 and table 10).
- Asia was the only region in FY 2014 that had an increase in overall value shipped compared to FY 2013—Africa and LAC decreased and there were no shipments to the E&E and Middle East. This increase in Asia is because Nepal ordered a significant increase from the previous two years and Bangladesh requested shipments in FY 2014 after not ordering in FY 2013 (see table 10).
- In Africa, Ethiopia was one of the few countries to request a large increase from FY 2013; however, during the past three years, there was no upward trend. Kenya did not request any injectable shipments in FY 2014, after showing a sizeable increasing trend. Uganda requests showed significant decreases in quantity and value (see table 10).
- Requests for injectable shipments for LAC have decreased during the past three years; only Haiti has recently requested injectables (see table 10).

Figure 31. Trends in Worldwide Injectable Contraceptive Shipments, FY 2005–2014

# Worldwide Contraceptive Implant Shipments



- The quantity of contraceptive implants requested continued to show a dramatic upward trend during the past 10 years, with a large increase in quantity shipped in FY 2014 over FY 2013 (see figure 34). Although the value of implant shipments decreased by 8 percent because of a unit price reduction, shipment quantities increased by 42 percent (see table 11).
- Consistent with the overall increase in shipments, FY 2014 saw an increase of three countries—to 23—ordering implants compared to 20 countries in FY 2013 (see table 11).




Figure 35. Contraceptive Implant Shipment Values by Region, FY 2014

- Implant orders shipped to Africa accounted for 93 percent of the total value for all contraceptive implant orders in FY 2014. The Asia, E&E, and LAC regions all requested small shipments to one country each; there were no shipments to the Middle East (see figure 35 and table 11).





Figure 36. Contraceptive Implant Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- Tanzania, Kenya, Malawi, Senegal, and Liberia received the largest value of implant shipments in FY 2014, totaling 61 percent of values shipped worldwide (see figure 36).
- The Africa region has a large overall increasing trend for quantities of implants shipped during the past three years. Angola, DRC, Ghana, Liberia, Malawi, and Tanzania significantly increased orders during the three-year period: FY 2012 to FY 2014 (see table 11).
- Senegal and Kenya showed the most significant increases over FY 2013 as demand from the Senegal Ministry of Health and the Kenya Medical Supplies Authority programs increased significantly (see table 11).
- Despite the overall increase in shipments to countries worldwide, Ethiopia, Uganda, Zambia, and Togo are indicating a downward trend in implant requests (see table 11).
- After a year of no implant shipments to Asia, Pakistan requested a total quantity in FY 2014 considerably larger than FY 2012 (see table 11).

Figure 34. Trends in Worldwide Contraceptive Implant Shipments, FY 2005–2014



# Worldwide Intrauterine Device Shipments



- Although IUD shipment quantities in FY 2014 were slightly less than FY 2013, the trend line is upward (see figure 37).
- There was a noted decrease in the number of countries placing requests: In FY 2014, 12 countries requested shipments compared to 17 in FY 2013 and 22 countries in FY 2012 (see table 12).




Figure 38. Intrauterine Device Shipment Values by Region, FY 2014

- IUDs were requested by the same four regions in FY 2014 as in FY 2013; Asia requested the largest percentage of shipment values, followed by Africa. E&E and LAC together requested less than two percent of shipment values, with small shipments directed to only one country in each region (see figure 38 and table 12).





Figure 39. Intrauterine Device Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- The value of IUDs shipped during the past three years is due to increasing and large orders for Pakistan. In FY 2014, shipments to Pakistan represented 60 percent of the total demand for IUDs and the entire quantity shipped to Asia (see figure 39 and table 12).
- During the past three years, the Africa region showed a noted decrease in total quantities ordered. Several countries in Africa that had orders in both FY 2012 and FY 2013 placed no orders for FY 2014: Guinea, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Togo, and Uganda. Additionally, Mozambique showed a continuous decline and Nigeria did not request IUDs in the past two years, after ordering a significant quantity in FY 2012 (see table 12).
- Similar to FY 2013, there were small shipments to only one country each in the E&E and LAC regions—Georgia and Haiti—and no shipments to the Middle East in FY 2014 (see table 12).

Figure 37. Trends in Worldwide Intrauterine Device Shipments, FY 2005–2014

# Worldwide Male Condom Shipments



- Male condom shipments decreased slightly in value and quantity from the previous year. Despite this decrease, the FY 2014 quantity was the third largest in the past 10 years and the overall trend continues upward (see figure 40). The increases in recent years are due to large shipments to Pakistan—more than 100 million annually since FY 2010.
- Aligning with the decrease in value and quantity of male condom shipments, 27 countries ordered male condoms in FY 2014, four fewer than FY 2013 (see table 13).




Figure 41. Male Condom Shipment Values by Region, FY 2014

- Three of the five regions requested shipments of male condoms in FY 2015: Africa, Asia, and LAC. Africa was the only region showing an increase over the prior two years; it accounted for 60 percent of shipment values (see figure 41 and table 13).





Figure 42. Male Condom Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- Pakistan requested 100 million fewer male condoms than in FY 2013, but the country was again the number one recipient in FY 2014, receiving 29 percent of all male condom shipment values (see figure 42 and table 13).
- Lesotho, Mali, Zimbabwe, Afghanistan, Myanmar, and the Dominican Republic continuously increased condom shipments during the past three years; Tanzania and Nepal also show notable increases over the prior two years and an overall upward trend (see table 13).
- After two years of not receiving male condoms, Côte d'Ivoire and Guinea both requested shipments in FY 2014 (see table 13).
- DRC received more than 80 million units after one year with no male condom shipments (see table 13).
- Zambia, Bangladesh, and Thailand requested fewer quantities or no quantities of male condoms in FY 2014; overall they had a continuous decrease during the past three years as support to public sector programs in Zambia and social marketing programs in the other two countries decreased (see table 13).

Figure 40. Trends in Worldwide Male Condom Shipments, FY 2005–2014

# Worldwide Female Condom Shipments



- Female condom shipments for FY 2014 are similar to the total quantity shipped in the previous year, with only a slight increase this year. Although there are year-to-year variations, the trend for the past 10 years is increasing; however, the trend for more recent years, overall, is steady (see figure 43).
- Overall, in FY 2014 nine countries ordered female condoms, compared to 12 countries in FY 2013 (see table 14).




Figure 44. Female Condom Shipment Values by Region, FY 2014

- For the first time in more than 10 years, requests from Africa accounted for all female condom orders shipped in FY 2014 (see figure 44). Even though Africa was the only region to request shipments, there was an overall 6 percent increase in value shipped during FY 2013 (see table 14).





Figure 45. Female Condom Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2014

- Zimbabwe again requested the largest value of shipments, receiving 42 percent of worldwide shipment values. DRC followed with 35 percent of worldwide shipment values in FY 2014 after a year without female condom shipments in FY 2013 (see figure 45 and table 14).
- Senegal, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, and Mali saw significant increases in quantity and value shipped during the past three years (see table 14).
- After two years of receiving significant quantities, Malawi and Zambia did not request any female condom orders for FY 2014; this reflects decreased demand from the Ministry of Health and PSI, respectively (see table 14).

Figure 43. Trends in Worldwide Female Condom Shipments, FY 2005–2014
