Call for Photos

In honor of World Contraception Day, USAID is holding a call for photos taken around the world that tell the story of family planning's positive impact on women, their families, and their communities. Photos can show how people in the field are working to support voluntary family planning programs and improve contraceptive access for women or highlight women and/or families who have benefited from USAID-funded programs. USAID will feature select photos through on our website and social media channels. Please send photo submissions to cfoster@usaid.gov by September 19, 2014.

Submission Requirements:

Please submit the highest resolution possible of your photos with caption and credit to cfoster@usaid.gov by September 19, 2014, following the requirements below (no exceptions):

- High-resolution, high quality photos that are at least 1024 pixels or larger (tall or wide) or around 300 pixels per inch. Please send the highest resolution photo possible (at least 1 MB).
- Accepted formats are high quality JPG and JPEG.
- Photos must each include a credit: name of photographer and organizational affiliation (if applicable)
- Photos must each include a unique, detailed caption, which includes a description of what is going on in the photo, who is involved, where it was taken, and how it is a part of or relates to family planning.
- Photos must each be an original submission (submitted by photographer or with permission).
- We will not accept a photo with an overlaid logo or text. Additionally, we will not accept a photo sent inside a Word document or PDF. Please send only the photo file.
- Individuals may submit up to five photos.

By submitting a photo, you give USAID the right to use it in current and future communications. Please contact cfoster@usaid.gov with any questions. We will notify you via email if your photo has been selected.

Here are just a few examples of the photo themes that we're looking out for:

- Meeting women's needs for family planning
- Supply chains and improving contraceptive security
- Family planning integration with HIV and/or Maternal and Child Health Programs
- Contraceptive technologies
- Innovations in service delivery
