


# Sector Reform and Utility Commercialization

## The Context

International donors are increasingly funding clean energy, electrification, and smart metering programs in developing countries around the globe in an effort to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and expand access to power in poor and rural areas. Programs such as the U.S. Government's Power Africa Initiative, the United Nations' Sustainable Energy for All, and the Asian Development Bank's Energy for All Initiative are making great strides to electrify the world and bring cleaner generation on the grid. Their progress, however, critically depends on local power utility companies that are able to sustain these new developments.

USAID's Sector Reform and Utility Commercialization (SRUC) Program seeks to support utility commercialization by enhancing the financial viability and long-term sustainability of electricity systems; thereby facilitating modern utility development and establishing the necessary preconditions for long-term clean energy investments. SRUC will work hand-in-hand with developing country power utilities to increase access, decrease technical losses, improve human capital, and embrace private sector market models.
