- 1.3 million people have gained access to improved sanitation facility

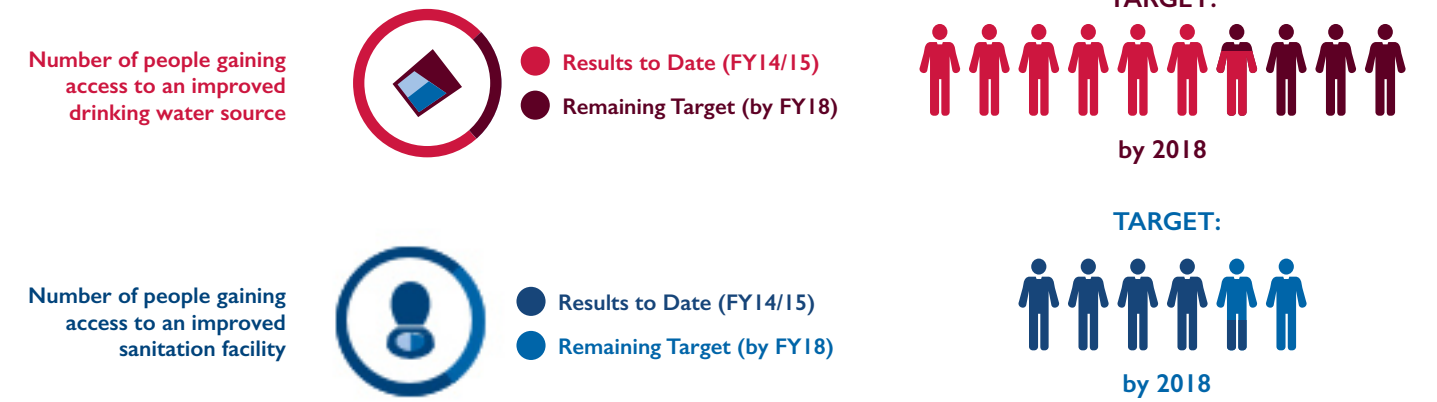
FY 2014

- 730,000 people benefit from improved agricultural management

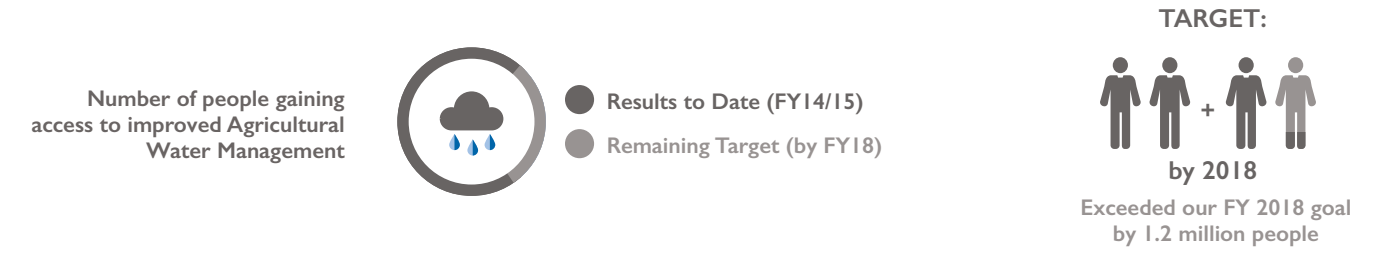
FY 2015

| <p>EVENT</p> <p>Creation of the Senator Paul Simon Water for the Poor Act of 2005</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>Made the provision of safe water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) an objective of U.S. foreign assistance.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Addressing Water Challenges in the Developing World: A Framework for Action</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>Joint U.S. Department of State and USAID Framework lays out guiding principles for U.S. foreign assistance strategic action in the water sector.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>USAID Administrator appoints the first Global Water Coordinator</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>The coordinator will be responsible for overseeing the development and implementation of an Agency water strategy, water programming in the Agency, and coordinating with other U.S. government Agencies and staff in USAID Missions.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>The Strategy Implementation Working Group created</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>The Strategy Implementation Working Group comprises representatives from all Washington-based regional and technical bureaus, and Dept. of State in an observer role. Through the Working Group, the Agency developed and released a Water and Development Strategy and Implementation Field Guide.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>First Agency Water and Development Strategy released</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>Operational principles provide foundation for integrating water issues into USAID programming. The goal of this Strategy is: To save lives and advance development through improvements in WASH programs, and through sound management and use of water for food security.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Water and Development Strategy - Implementation Field Guide</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>Provides guidance for USAID staff to understand and apply the USAID Water and Development Strategy, and establishes criteria to prioritize countries for WASH assistance and identifies performance indicators and specific funding parameters.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Multi-Sectoral Nutrition Strategy released</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>This Strategy's multi-sectoral approach addresses both direct and underlying causes of malnutrition, and its focus on linking humanitarian assistance with development programming, including WASH linkages, helps build resilience to shocks in vulnerable communities.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Senator Paul Simon Water for the World Act of 2014 signed by President</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>Water for the World Act of 2014 builds on the 2005 Act. It expands the role of the global water coordinator and sets principles to prioritize WASH needs and achieve maximum impact. Emphasizes that resources go to countries with the greatest WASH needs and opportunities.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>WADI awarded</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>The Water and Development IDIQ (WADI) supports USAID's global implementation of the Water and Development Strategy. Programs implemented through WADI reflect the Agency's strategic direction in the water sector, including improving health outcomes through WASH services and managing water more productively to enhance food security.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>Goal 6: Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Strategy priority country programs launched</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>A new generation of programs launched across priority countries in Africa and Asia. Programs address key WASH needs and use multisectoral approaches.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Central WASH mechanisms and partnerships awarded</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>New central mechanisms to support WASH finance; sustainability, communications and knowledge management; research; monitoring and evaluation; and water security. WADA II awarded. USAID joins Toilet Board Coalition.</p> | <p>EVENT</p> <p>Global Water Strategy submitted by President to Congress by October 1, 2017</p> <p>SIGNIFICANCE</p> <p>The 2014 Water for World Act mandates a single government-wide Global Water Strategy that addresses WASH, water resource management, and trans-boundary issues.</p> |
