

Subject Line: Revision to USAID's Office of Food for Peace Indicators

Dear FACG PVO Colleagues:

USAID's Office of Food for Peace (FFP) has revised the list of indicators for Title II programs, effective April 9, 2013. The list of Title II indicators is attached and includes indicators for baseline, final evaluation, and annual monitoring. All Title II programs awarded starting in FY 2012 should reference this list to determine the indicators for which they are accountable.

FFP has revised the list of indicators to better document and compare Title II programs' outcomes, generate a greater wealth of standardized data to monitor program progress, and provide more detailed information on program accomplishments to stakeholders. FFP has aligned Title II indicators to the extent possible with Feed the Future (FTF) and Standard Foreign Assistance (F) indicators. Given the high level of complementarity between FTF and FFP program objectives and activities, FFP has adopted applicable FTF indicators. FFP has also adopted relevant F indicators to help ensure greater standardization of reporting on foreign assistance activities across U.S. Government agencies.

Guide to Indicator List:

The list contains both baseline/final evaluation and annual monitoring indicators. Indicators for baseline and final evaluation are marked "baseline and final evaluation" in the "Frequency of Collection" column and will be collected by an external contractor. Annual monitoring indicators are marked "annually" in the "Frequency of Collection" column. Title II implementing partners are responsible for collecting annual monitoring indicators. Partners are also responsible for reporting to FFP on the results of annual monitoring, baseline, and final evaluation indicators at the end of each fiscal year (FY) in the annual results reports due the first Monday of November.

The FFP indicators are classified as follows:

- Indicators classified as **R** are required for all development programs.
- Indicators classified as **RiA** are required if applicable for all development programs that have relevant interventions. In some cases, the relevant intervention has been specified in the applicability column in the table. In other cases, this information will be forthcoming.
- Indicators classified as **S** are standard but not required. Programs implementing activities in a relevant area should consider using these indicators to the extent applicable to develop a robust monitoring plan.

Implementing partners should use this key to determine the indicators applicable to their Title II programs.
