

## Food for Peace Photo Contest

**Submission Deadline: October 31, 2016**

Help us tell the story of Food for Peace and its accomplishments in reducing hunger, poverty and malnutrition—with photos.

### **Submission requirements:**

-High-resolution, high quality photos that are at least 1024 pixels or larger (tall or wide) or around 300 pixels per inch. Please send us the highest resolution version of the photo you have (at least 1 MB). If you are using Photoshop, please send only level 7 or higher compressed photos

-Accepted formats: high quality JPG and JPEG

-Photos must each be an original submission (submitted by photographer or with permission)

-Photos must each include a credit: name of photographer and organizational affiliation (if applicable)

-Photos must each include a unique, robust caption, which includes a description of what is going on in the photo, who is involved, where it was taken, and how it is a part of or relates to Food for Peace

- Photos should “tell the story” of Food for Peace and its accomplishments

To submit a photo, please email [FFPDocs@amexdc2.com](mailto:FFPDocs@amexdc2.com) with all the information required above and attach photo(s). Individuals may submit up to five photos. Submissions with a logo, caption or time stamp visible on top of the photo will not be accepted. ***The deadline for photo submissions is October 31, 2016.***

Some examples of the types of photos we’re looking for:

- Creative uses of FFP food bags and containers
- Action Shots i.e. a farmer working in a field or a distribution
- Beneficiary portraits
- Research and innovation, such as new technologies, in action

- Cash and Voucher based programs in action
- Agricultural innovations that benefit smallholder farmers
- Women's empowerment
- Improved nutrition
- Climate and environment-sensitive development

***We encourage you to think outside the box when selecting photos!***
