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

Kuram Tangi Dam Project

This project performs a comprehensive assessment of environmental and social impact of the proposed multi-purpose Kuram Tangi dam and irrigation system. Work includes preparation of an action plan for the full resettlement land acquisition and compensation, and an Environmental Mitigation and Management Plan in compliance with the Government of Pakistan and U.S. government regulations.

The Kuram Tangi multi-purpose project would include construction of a power plant on the Kurram River in the Federally Administered Tribal Area (FATA) of Pakistan and expansion of an irrigation system in one of the most underdeveloped regions in the country. The resulting increase in agricultural production and the generation of hydropower would increase trade and employment opportunities for a population of 3.2 million people.



OBJECTIVES

To evaluate environmental and social impact of the proposed construction of the multi-purpose Kuram Tangi Dam.

MAIN ACTIVITIES

- Conduct a Scoping Exercise as required in the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title 22 Part 216â€”Environmental Procedures to define the scope of work for the environmental assessment.
- Conduct an environmental assessment consisting of (1) Resettlement Land Acquisition and Compensation Action Plan, (2) Gender Plan, (3) Environmental Mitigation and Monitoring Plan, (4) Cultural Heritage Preservation Plan, (5) Instrumentation and Monitoring Plan, (6) Emergency Preparedness Plan

RESULTS TO DATE

- Scoping Exercise was completed in March, 2013 and the resulting Scoping Statement has been approved on 10 May, 2013.
