POLITICAL PROCESSES STRENGTHENING ACTIVITY

Political Processes Strengthening is a seven-year, \$13.8 million activity to bolster political pluralism in Serbia by strengthening the capacity of political actors, increasing citizen-driven dialogue with political actors, and supporting long-standing efforts to improve the transparency and integrity of the electoral process, thus increasing Serbia's commitment to democratic values.

ACTIVITIES

- Conducting public opinion research to support political parties, movements, elected officials, and other political and civic actors to better understand citizens' interests and communicate with them.
- Providing technical assistance to strengthen the capacity of political parties and citizen groups to advance the accountability of leaders and parties as well as their organizational, communication, and citizen outreach skills.
- Providing support to domestic institutions in charge of elections to increase the integrity and transparency of the election process.
- Supporting the Central Election Commission to improve poll worker training and voter education and information, increase accessibility of polls, and enhance trust in the elections process.
- Working with the Anti-Corruption Agency to improve their campaign monitoring methodology and strengthen the capacity of their finance oversight department to oversee political party expenses during the upcoming elections.

RESULTS

- The International Republican Institute (IRI) and the National Democratic Institute (NDI) have carried out capacity building activities with ten political parties and movements across the political spectrum in Serbia.
- The International Foundation for Electoral System (IFES) provided key, targeted assistance to election administration authorities to plan and communicate appropriate COVID-19 safety measures during the 2020 elections through nationwide voter information services. IFES conducted an overarching assessment of core elements of the electoral process that is

central to election administration delivery. The assessment identified key recommendations designed to improve election administration, management, access and adjudication.

- Since November 2019, NDI has conducted six face-to-face public opinion polls to identify trends in citizens' priorities, level of satisfaction with the government and political actors, receptivity to disinformation, and attitudes about upcoming elections and COVID crisis. Poll results are always presented to interested political parties and movements, government stakeholders and international stakeholders.
- IRI runs a leadership academy (Advanced Leadership in Politics Institute - ALPI) for young political leaders. In 2019/2020, ALPI gathered 26 young political leaders from six different political parties who started a joint [ALPI blog](#), undertook a community survey and published analysis of the results, and started a [YouTube channel](#) and monthly podcast. In 2021/2022, the second generation of ALPI leaders will start their leadership growth.
- The Government of Serbia granted observer status to IFES and NDI in the voter list verification working group.
