

U.S. Response to the Venezuela Regional Crisis

Venezuela is experiencing a political and economic crisis—marked by devastating hyperinflation—that has led to severe lack of access to food and critical medicine shortages and has driven more than 5 million Venezuelans to flee the once-prosperous country. The United States is providing life-saving humanitarian and development assistance inside Venezuela and throughout the region to meet emergency needs, respond to COVID-19, stem the spread of infectious diseases, and support countries that are hosting Venezuelans who have fled their country.

More than \$1.2 billion

to support U.S. humanitarian and development programs, of which **more than \$1 billion** is providing life-saving aid to both Venezuelans **inside Venezuela**, as well as to the millions of Venezuelans forced to flee to **17 countries** regionally.
